This year brings many exciting changes to our club.

In February, I was invited to participate in a 1 week International Instructors' seminar. I am proud to report that, at that event, I was awarded my 4th Dan by the President of the GTF. I am now "officially" certified as an International Examiner and Instructor for the Global Tae Kwon Do Federation (GTF).

This is the eleventh year I have taught Tae Kwon Do in Constance Bay, and for the past several years, we have been affiliated with Winning Circle in Kanata. Mr. Ah-Yuen of Winning Circle recently left the GTF; however, I wanted to maintain membership with the Federation so I decided to discontinue our affiliation with Winning Circle and to operate Sparks Tae Kwon Do independently.

Students will have noticed some recent changes in our club with our new operating structure.

Sparks Tae Kwon Do now has a distinct new logo. We have new uniforms featuring our new logo, and we have supplied all students with patches to sew over the logos of their old uniforms.

In addition, introduced an improved and up-dated curriculum for the school. There are now a total of 15 ranks between white and black belt. Some new material has been added, including three new patterns in honour of Grand Master Park; however, seasoned students will still recognize kicks. the punches and Hyung patterns the club has practised for many years.

No student will lose any rank they have already been awarded and each student will be given the time to learn any material that has been introduced to the curriculum.

New Logo

The new logo was designed specifically for Sparks Tae Kwon Do and has special significance to our club in Constance Bay while it respects the Korean roots of the martial art we practise.

In the Orient, the pine tree is a symbol of longevity and wisdom. It is a major aspect of the landscape in Constance Bay and in the Ottawa Valley with its history of logging and the lumber industry.

The stylized pine tree is surrounded by a circular pattern that resembles the yin and yan symbol of the Orient.

The Canadian flag is our national symbol.

The Korean characters on the left of the logo translate to "honour" and on the right mean "strength of spirit". These are two principle characteristics we strive for in our martial art.
